



This May is a very unique month to be a church organist. There is such a broad spectrum of music being played this month from the bombastic and triumphant ascension tunes of *Crown Him with Many Crowns* to patriotic march style hymns like *Battle Hymn* for Memorial Day.

From the Organist


I wanted to speak briefly about the organ concert on the 17th of May. I am really excited about the opportunity to perform for not just the church but the city of Anchorage as well. A huge thank you to everyone who has had a hand in making this concert happen and a special thanks to Allison and Debbie who have helped promote the concert through both the social and local media. I will apologize in advance to those who assist in preparing the sanctuary for the concert. Both the organ and the piano are very heavy pieces of equipment and require multiple hands to move but your help is also much appreciated.

For the concert, I have chosen a list of sacred songs and medleys that are both entertaining and appropriate for the setting as well as some Broadway show tunes that express the organ in a way different from how it is heard on Sundays. In preparing for this concert I literally beat my head against the wall coming up with a set list that I felt best expressed the console here because as an organist, you are expressing the instrument rather than

the instrumentalist. What works tone wise for one organ may not work for another. All organs are voiced and expressed differently. An 8-foot Gedackt stop on the Casavant pipe organ at First Presbyterian Downtown has a completely different shape, body and tone than the organ here and vice versa. That is what makes being an organist so much fun. Understanding and manipulating a consoles strengths and weaknesses is a great challenge.

Again, I just wanted to say thank you to everyone at the church who have given me the opportunity to play the organ and for the purchasing of the new organ. A big thank you also goes to Dale Berry for pushing me to do the organ concert.

The Garden Plans

We are getting ready to start gardening. The vegetables that are produced from our garden are all donated to the Chugiak/Eagle River Food Pantry. This year we are hoping to add 2 additional beds, giving us 12 beds total. This will cost around \$400 for the soil and seeds needed. We are also looking to remove the woodchip berm along the north side of the church. We currently have raspberry plants growing in the old playground area, and will move them to the woodchip area. With enough contribution of help and funds we would also like to build a partitioned compost bin.

We will strive to produce 500 pounds of high quality produce. We will need your help to reach this goal. First, many items need to be purchased, such as soil and seeds. Any contribution you can make towards the Garden Fund would help. Second, we need volunteers to help with the building of new beds and cleaning of the grounds. And last, but NOT least the weekly care of the grounds and garden beds.

Let us see who has the green thumbs and let's turn those black thumbs a new beautiful shade of green and help with one of our greatest missions of the church.
