### FROM THE PASTOR: Summertime Notes!

### Dear Friends,

May was cold and rainy and it felt as if summer and the season of green growing things would never come. As I write this, though, it's almost June and it's finally warmer and the sun is out, at least some of the time! We've planted our garden beds here at ERPC and some of us are growing flowers and vegetables at home. Our lawns are green and the salmon are coming back to the rivers. Every year I am again in awe and wonder at the beauty of God's creation seen so magnificently in the beauty of Alaska's abundance. We are blessed to share in that creative work. This quote from the Newsletter website is apt when we think of God's amazing creation:

Summer often reminds pastor Walter Wangerin Jr. of his father-in-law, a farmer. Farmers, he writes, remember "that we belong to the earth, and the earth belongs to God." Recalling his father-in-law working the fields, he states, "Surely I don't suppose that we shall live by the horse again, but I plead that we live on this earth with reverence."

Because God gave people "dominion" over creation (see Genesis 1:28), we are "God's emblem within the universe, God's signature upon the work he had accomplished," Wangerin writes. "We were placed here to serve God by serving the earth and so to be served by it."

Who demonstrates that better than a farmer nurturing soil and seeds to yield abundant harvest? "By his reverential stance," Wangerin concludes, "the farmer calls again for honor to God and kindness to creation, that we dress and till and keep it rightly."

During worship this summer we will be talking about work – God at work in us as the Holy Spirit disciples us into the people God is calling us to be and God at work in our community as we learn to be the body of Christ in the world, tending and caring for each other and our community, just like Wangerin's farmer. In June we will be looking primarily at the stories of Samuel and King David from 1 Samuel and in July we will focus on Paul's letter to the Ephesian church. Each has much to teach us about how God works in us individually and together.

We will also welcome new musicians in worship after we say good-bye to Mike on June 3rd. Connor Spencer will play the piano for us just as he did last year and Larry Baumgartner (Suellyn Novak's husband) will play the organ a few Sundays as well. And in that light - please tell everyone you know that we are searching for both an organist and a choir director. I know that God has his hand on us and will provide as he has in the past; I also know that the more people who are aware of our staffing needs the easier it will be to fill the positions. We have job descriptions available if you'd like them.

There will be a change in office staffing for most of the summer too. Allison Denton, our administrative assistant, will be on maternity leave beginning June 18<sup>th</sup>. Kathryn Bistodeau, a local college student, will be in the office during June and July. Stop by and say hi! We expect Allison's return in early August.

Finally, I want to leave you with a prayer for Independence Day, offered to the U.S. Senate by the great Presbyterian preacher Peter Marshall: Lord Jesus, thou who art the way, the truth and the life; hear us as we pray for the truth that shall make all free. Teach us that liberty is not only to be loved but also to be lived. Liberty is too precious a thing to be buried in books. It costs too much to be hoarded. Help us see that our liberty is not the right to do as we please, but the opportunity to please to do what is right. Amen and amen.
