# FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends.

All of a sudden, winter is here! Halloween candy has gone on sale and the stores are full of Thanksgiving and Christmas decorations. We are looking forward to our November and December worship and fellowship events and anticipating the start of Advent on December 2.

I'm writing this article, though, on November 1 – All Saints' Day. In the early church it was celebrated to honor those who had been martyred because of their faith in Christ. In succeeding centuries, it became a way to remember the saints – known and unknown – who came before us and set an example of how we follow Jesus. Many churches, particularly Catholic and Episcopalian congregations, have a worship service of candle-lighting and prayer, giving thanks for the gifts of our ancestors and beloved family who are rejoicing in heaven.

This Sunday we will light candles and gather around the Lord's Table to share the feast our Lord provides for us. We will remember those we've loved and lost and the long procession of saints who were faithful followers of Jesus. Some of us will be joyful in remembering, for others the grief is still new, and the rest will experience joy and sorrow intermingled.

I found these words this week, written by Jonathan Edwards, the great American revival preacher who lived in the first half of the 18<sup>th</sup> century: *Christ is not only a remedy for your weariness and trouble, but he will give you an abundance of the contrary, joy and delight. They who come to Christ do not only come to a resting place after they have been wandering in a wilderness, but they come to a banqueting house where they may rest, and where they may feast. They may cease from their former troubles and toils, and they may enter upon a course of delights and spiritual joys.* 

This fall it seems that we are all 'wandering in a wilderness', impacted both by personal griefs and struggles as well as the divisions and tragedies we are experiencing as a nation. Sometimes it seems that there is nothing that we as individuals can do. Romans 12:12 says *Rejoice in hope, be patient in trouble, and keep on praying*. That's exactly what the saints did and what each of us can do every day as we follow Jesus. That's the promise of our faith – that God will keep faith with us as we work together to follow him.

So, this month is one of remembrance and of gratitude – for the abundance of God's gifts and for the people he has gifted us with, both the living and our beloved dead. Thomas Merton says: To be grateful is to recognize the love of God in everything he has given us — and he has given us everything. Every breath we draw is a gift of his love. Every moment of existence is a grace, for it brings with it immense graces from him.

Gratitude, therefore, takes nothing for granted, is never unresponsive, is constantly awakening to new wonder and to praise of the goodness of God; for the grateful person knows that God is good not by hearsay but by experience, and that is what makes all the difference.

That does make all the difference, doesn't it? As we experience God's grace we know that all the promises of God are true — so we can be faithful to rejoice, patient as we wait, and always keep on praying. May God bless you all as we serve Him together — and Happy Thanksgiving!


