The Earthquake Restoration Committee has been busy getting the needed information together to proceed with building restoration. We are receiving estimates for sheet rock repairs, ceiling grid and tile replacement, paint, electrical and heating systems and other necessary repairs and renovations. We are contracting with a local builder to complete the repairs in our tenant space and that process will begin soon. We expect the other work to begin in March and take several months. We are also seeking funding sources since our insurance deductible won't meet the majority of repair costs. There will be a full report at our congregational meeting on January 27th. So far, we have replaced some kitchen appliances that broke in the earthquake and used the Lowe's cards to buy wood to replace broken shelves. I am also using my coffee cup every morning (3). Thank you all so much for your thoughtfulness and grace to me, not just at Christmas but every day.

We all have much to be thankful for at the beginning of this new year. Every Sunday we are made aware that we are continuing to recover from the earthquake and there is a committee working diligently to get the needed repairs and renovations completed. We so appreciate your patience as we deal with the ongoing heating and sound issues caused by the open ceilings in the Sanctuary. We have had a few plumbing and electrical issues that may or may not be earthquakerelated but we are gathering the information we need to complete the repairs. Children's Sunday school continues every week and our Youth Confirmation class is meeting after worship most Sundays. We will confirm those young people on Easter Sunday – what a joy that will be! Adult Education has taken the form of Wednesday evening Bible study; see the signup sheet on the board outside the kitchen so we can order you a book. There are ongoing monthly fellowship events as well and those too are posted on the board.

Our worship theme in this season of Epiphany is A Light to the Nations and every week we are exploring how the revelation of Christ impacts our faith and our ministry. Epiphany teaches us that the light of Christ that first shone in a stable 2,000 years ago has continued to shine down all the centuries since and will continue shining through each and all of us. 2 Corinthians 4:6 says For God, who said, "let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God shining in the face of Christ. Just as a candle's light isn't darkened but magnified by sharing, Christ's light grows as each of us learns how he wants us to shine. And just as the sunrise slowly and imperceptibly lightens the eastern sky every morning, so does the work of Christ continue - sometimes hidden and slow-growing and sometimes unmistakably bright.



2018 Garden Harvest

One of the great ministries of our church are the garden beds. Every year seeds and bulbs are planted in the spring and starting around the end of July we can begin to harvest the vegetables.

In 2018 we planted peas, green beans, carrots and potatoes. The peas are the first to start producing, with a total harvest of 37.7 pounds. WOW! Next were the Green beans, giving us 18.7 pounds and the carrots with 93 pounds of vitamin enriched goodness. Lastly but not least, were the potatoes at a whopping 144.9 pounds. That's a total of 294.3 pounds!!

All the produce that was lovingly collected from these beds was donated to the Chugiak/Eagle River Food Pantry to be distributed to the people of our community in need.

Thank you to everyone that helped with this ministry. A big THANK YOU goes to Brent Koenen for heading this program and putting in so much time and work and love. Your passion for this ministry shows and is greatly appreciated.

Please look for updates on how you can help with the 2019 Garden. We are hoping to add some different vegetables and improve on the quality and quantity.
