Update from the Food Pantry: November has been very busy! The appointment times are filled, and the FP considering increasing their opening times to accommodate more people. Due to COVID, many of the annual food drives have been cancelled or reduced. Once a week the FP shops and obtains food supplies from the Alaska Food Bank; however, their shelves are mostly bare. Therefore, the FP is buying large quantities of food at Costco, Walmart, and Fred Meyer. Thanks to community donations and a soon-to-end Breakfast Grant, our checkbook balance has remained steady, but I suspect will start to decline. Please check your own pantries for any "unneeded", "don't really like anymore", or "golly, that has been sitting there a long time" items--are all needed and distributed at the FP.
