LITANY FOR ALL SAINTS DAY

People: We give you thanks for all they were; mothers, fathers, sons, daughters, and friends.

Leader: We remember those health care workers who paid the ultimate price while caring for others.

People: There is no greater love than this: that a person would lay down their life for the sake of others.

Leader: Finally, we remember those whom we have known and loved and lost this year, who we now name before you:
