Happenings in the Presbytery

(February 2026)

Hello from the Presbytery Office! We want to reach all of our members (including you!) to keep you aware of the highlights, joys, and needs of your Presbytery. We also have a monthly newsletter, which you can sign up to receive at www.yukonpres.org.

Quick Facts! The Presbytery of Yukon covers an incredibly large geographic area – most of the state of Alaska – with twenty churches spread across the North Slope, Bering Sea, Interior, and Southcentral worshipping in (at least) four languages. The office has three employees; Rev. Elizabeth Schultz, Executive Presbyter (full time, Anchorage); Elder Doreen McNeill, Stated Clerk (part time, North Pole); and Adam Lees, Administrator of Finance and Operations Adam Lees (part time, Anchorage).

Semiannual Meetings! Pastors, Commissioned Lay Pastors, Certified Christian Educators, and Elder Commissioners elected from each congregation gather twice annually for fellowship and to conduct business. Though we have historically met in-person, the increasing financial burden of travel has led to discussions about changing the format (hybrid or virtual) and/or number of meetings.

Our first meeting of 2026 takes place this month from *February 27th to 28th at Trinity Presbyterian Church in South Anchorage*. Visitors are welcome but should register so we know how much food to make and materials to produce.

Joys! Our diverse churches are making an incredible difference in each of their communities. Our rural churches serve as the hosts for food banks, elder nutrition programs, funerals, and sing-spirations – and lodging for an occasional guest. All churches are active in outreach and mission, providing multiple opportunities to serve and grow.

Needs! Volunteers are always needed to serve on our various committees, to provide rides or meals for events and meetings, and to assist with communications and ongoing efforts for increased financial stability. Our Presbytery is proud to financially support our rural churches, but in a time of decreased church giving, we are in great need of increased help.
